

## About our instructor

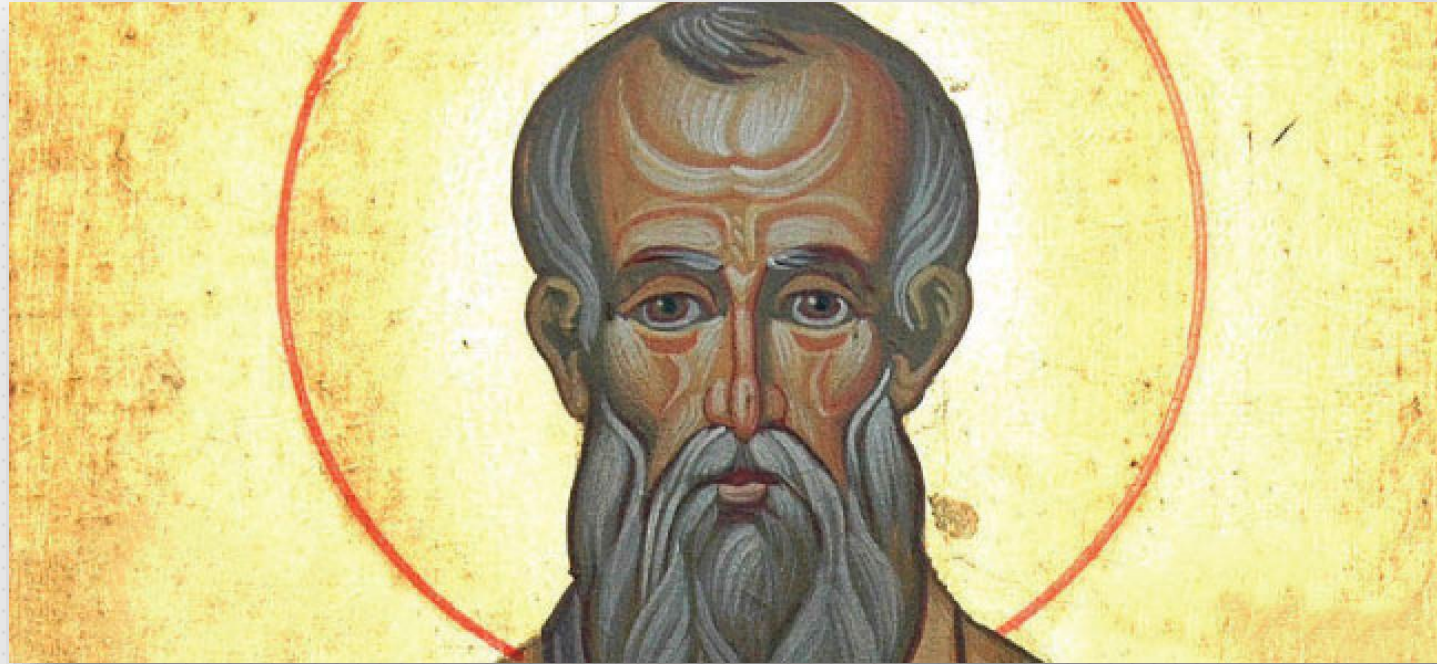

**St Paul:  
Life, Letters, Legacy**

## 2020 Topic – *St Paul: Life, Letters, Legacy*

This year's seminar will explore the life and writings of St Paul, and their enduring place in Orthodox Christian thought. We will begin with key academic and historical questions before moving to a careful examination of the letters themselves. We will then shift to a discussion of Paul's reception by later Orthodox thinkers, including Sts Gregory the Theologian, Jerome, and John Chrysostom. We will also consider the ways that Orthodox readings of Paul have differed from Roman Catholic and Protestant readings in recent centuries. Key topics will include soteriology, pneumatology, Christology, ecclesiology, pastoral care, and sacramental thought in Paul and his Orthodox readers to the present day.

**Books:** In addition to the letters of Paul, registrants will be expected to read several texts prior to the seminar. A reading list will be provided.

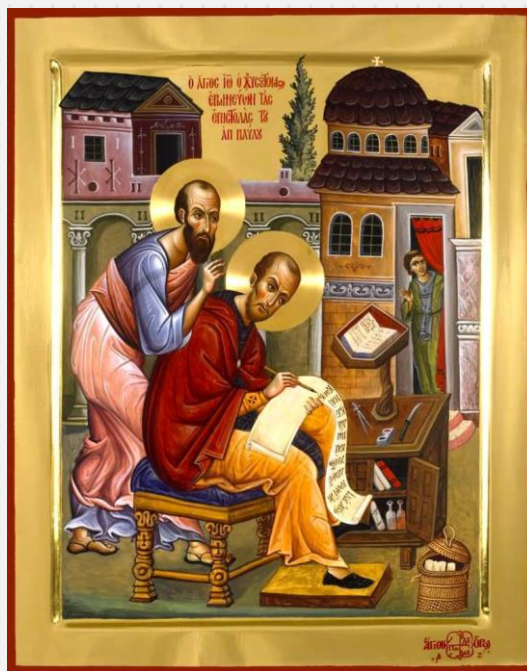

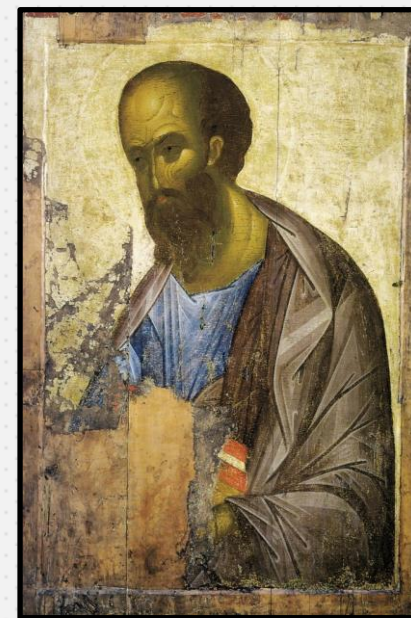
